

Update – outbreaks & emerging infections


- ► COVID-19

IPC Audit in Care Homes

- ▶ IPC Audits provide an opportunity to assess current IPC practices within the care home that prevent and manage infections.
- They also help to identify any areas where improvement may be required
- ► The audit is 100% supportive we are not there to point fingers!
- ▶ On average, audits are undertaken every 12-18 months





Audit Process



- A phone call or email is sent to the home to arrange a suitable date / time for the IPC audit. The audit is performed by one or two CIPC Nurses.
- ▶ Generally it takes 1.5 2.5 hrs. and it would be expected for a senior representative to accompany when reviewing the environment / documentation.
- Any specific issues would generally be discussed at the time of the audit.
- On completion, the report is written up usually within 2 weeks and sent back to the home & QAT with RAG rating and recommended actions
- Normally we expect a response back with update on actions is within 3 months though this may be less if there are more immediate actions

RAG Rating Percentages

0% to 70% = Red

71% to 91% = Amber

92% to 100% = Green
