A The schemes for co-ordinated admissions in 2017/2018

The schemes have now been updated for the co-ordination of admission into Reception and year 7 in September 2017.

B School admissions arrangements for 2017/2018

I attach a copy of the finalised admission arrangements for both primary and secondary schools (community and voluntary-controlled).

C Co-ordination of In-Year Admission Arrangements

There is no statutory requirement for in year admissions to be coordinated by the Local Authority however the Bolton will operate a coordinated scheme. Those Academies, Free Schools and voluntary-aided schools who intend to manage their own applications for in year admission must notify the Local Authority as soon as possible.

Copies of all three schemes are attached.

Copies of the relevant admission policies determined for all voluntary-aided schools, Academies and Free Schools can be found on the website for the respective schools.

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Proposed Scheme for the Coordination of In-Year Admissions to Primary Schools – September 2017

1. Applicants should contact the Local Authority or the school where they are seeking admission
2. Applications forms are available from:
 1. Pupil & Student Services
 2. Bolton Council website
 3. Schools
3. For Voluntary Aided Schools/Academies applicants may need to complete a Supplementary Information Form (SIF) obtainable from the school which should be returned together with the application form
4. Parent/carer must return the completed Part1 and Part 2 application forms to the preferred school or the Local Authority (Pupil & Student Services) together with any documentation to support the application.
5. If the application form is returned to the Local Authority the LA will liaise with the school to determine if a place can be offered.
6. If the application is returned to the school and a place is available in the relevant year group the school must contact the Local Authority (Pupil & Student Services) before offering a place so that all applicants can be given due consideration.
7. If the application is returned to the school and the school is full in the relevant year group the school must forward the application to the Local Authority.
8. All applications must be processed within 5 to 10 school days of receipt
9. Where a place can be offered then the school must agree a start date with the parent /carer to admit the student within 5 to 10 school days of the offer being made
10. Where schools are full in the relevant year group, parents must be referred to the Local Authority (Pupil & Student Services). The pupil's name will be added to the waiting lists which will be maintained by the Local Authority. Waiting lists will be prioritised in accordance with the schools published admission criteria
11. The Local Authority (Pupil & Student Services) will provide parents with relevant advice and guidance of the appeals procedures.
12. Schools and academies must inform the Local Authority of the outcome of all applications for admission.
13. All schools and academies **must** inform the Local Authority of places as and when they become available so that places can be offered to children from the waiting lists

Proposed Scheme for the Coordination of In-Year Admissions to Secondary Schools – September 2017

1. Applicants should contact the Local Authority
2. Applications forms are available from:
 1. Pupil & Student Services
 2. Bolton Council website
3. For Canon Slade School, St James CE Secondary School and Bolton Muslim Girls School applicants may need to complete a Supplementary Information Form (SIF) obtainable from the school which should be returned to the relevant school.
4. Parent/carer must return completed application form and Information Passport to Pupil & Student Services together with any documentation to support the application.
5. The Local Authority will liaise with the school to determine if a place can be offered
6. All applications will be processed within 5 to 10 school days of receipt
7. If a place can be offered then the Local Authority will forward the application details to the school. The school must agree a start date with the parent/carer to admit the student within 5 to 10 school days of the offer being made
8. Where schools are full in the relevant year group, the Local Authority will provide parents with relevant advice and guidance of the appeals procedures.
9. Schools and academies must inform the Local Authority of the outcome of all applications for admission.
10. All schools and academies **must** inform the Local Authority of places as and when they become available so that places can be offered to children from the waiting lists

PROPOSED ADMISSION POLICY FOR COMMUNITY AND VOLUNTARY-CONTROLLED
PRIMARY SCHOOLS 2017/2018**

The Council will admit all children with a Statement of Special Educational Needs or an Education Health and Care Plan, in whose statement/plan the school is named

The proposed policy for admission to community and controlled primary schools for 2017/2018 is as follows.

If the school is over-subscribed the following criteria will be applied to all applications in priority order.

1. Children in Public Care (Looked After Children) including adopted children who were previously in care and children who leave care under a special guardianship or residence order. A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of the local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social functions (see definition in Section 22 (1) of the Children Act 1989)
2. Other children who are considered as “vulnerable” whose application for the preferred school is supported by the Assistant Director for Social Care. This will include;
 - a. Children for whom there is a child protection plan or has been within a 12 month period.
 - b. Children who have had a period in care within 2 years of the admission application and are still receiving social care services
 - c. Children who are considered to be at significant risk of becoming looked after
 - d. Children who are living in temporary accommodation due to fleeing violence and the area for rehousing has been identified
3. Children who will have older siblings in years Reception to Year 6 of the preferred school at the time of application and at the date of admission. Sibling includes full, step, half, foster and adopted brothers and sisters living at the same address.
4. Children who have strong Church connections where the school is a Church school.

Parents must complete the supplementary form attached to the application form as evidence that the family and the child are active worshipping members at the church to which the school is affiliated. Active worshipping members of the church will be those persons who worship at least once a month sustained over a period of a year prior to the closing date for applications.

5. Children who suffer from some medical condition or disability, which makes it, better for them to attend that school rather than another. Places will only be offered under this criterion if the child has a certified medical condition with strong professional supporting evidence confirming that existing exceptional problems with the child’s health would be seriously exacerbated if a place were not made at the preferred school. Parents applying under this criterion must provide a letter from the child’s GP/Consultant setting out the reasons why the school is the most suitable school and details of the child’s medical condition. Medical evidence must be submitted by 15th January 2017. Evidence received after this date will not be taken into consideration

6. Proximity (Where you live).

Shortest walking distance to the preferred school minus shortest walking distance to the nearest/next nearest school plus 100 to create a ranking value. The lower the ranking value the higher the priority for a place.

The nearest/next nearest school will include all community, voluntary-controlled, foundation, free and academy schools whether in the Bolton Borough or not.

- If any categories are oversubscribed then geographical proximity (as set out in category 6 above) will be used as a tie breaker. If the proximity value is equal then random allocation will be used as a tie-breaker. This will be carried out by an officer of Bolton Council independent to the School Admission Team
- The shortest walking route will be that determined by the Local Authority using only those public rights of way recognised within the measuring system. This will be measured using Routefinder, a computerised mapping system which uses the ordnance survey integrated network which measures from the point on the highway nearest to the centre of the home property and the designated main entrance to the school. In the event of a tie-break within a block of flats those living furthest from the communal entrance will be given priority.

ADMISSION POLICY FOR COMMUNITY SECONDARY SCHOOLS 2017/2018

The Council will admit all children with a Statement of Special Educational Needs or an Education Health and Care Plan, in whose statement/plan the school is named

The policy for admission to community and controlled secondary schools for 2017/2018 is as follows.

All parents will be provided with an application form on which they will be asked to express 3 preferences in order of priority for a primary school. Places will be allocated up the published admission number for each school.

If the school is over-subscribed the following criteria will be applied to all applications in priority order.

1. Children in Public Care (Looked After Children) who are the subject of a full care order including adopted children who were previously in care and children who leave care under a special guardianship or residence order. A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see definition in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989).
2. Other children who are considered as “vulnerable” whose application for the preferred school is supported by the Assistant Director for Social Care. This will include;
 - a. Children for whom there is a child protection plan or has been within a 12 month period.
 - b. Children who have had a period in care within 2 years of the admission application and are still receiving social care services
 - c. Children who are considered to be at significant risk of becoming looked after
 - d. Children who are living in temporary accommodation due to fleeing violence and the area for rehousing has been identified
3. Children who will have older siblings in years 7 to 11 of the preferred school at the time of application and the date of admission. Siblings can include full, step, half, foster and adopted brothers and sisters living at the same address.
4. Children who suffer from some medical condition or disability, which makes it, better for them to attend that school rather than another. Places will only be offered under this criterion if the child has a certified medical condition with strong professional supporting evidence confirming that existing exceptional problems with the child’s health would be seriously exacerbated if a place were not made at the preferred school. Medical evidence MUST be provided at the time of application. Parents applying under this criterion must provide a letter from the child’s GP/Consultant setting out the reasons why the school is the most suitable school and details of the child’s medical condition. Medical evidence must be submitted by 31st October 2016. Evidence received after this date will not be taken into consideration
5. Proximity (Where you live).

Shortest walking distance to the preferred school minus shortest walking distance to the nearest/next nearest school plus 100 to create a ranking value. The lower the ranking value the higher the priority for a place.

The nearest/next nearest school will include all community, voluntary-controlled, foundation, free and academy schools whether in the Bolton Borough or not.

- If any categories are oversubscribed then geographical proximity (as set out in category 6 above) will be used as a tie breaker. If the proximity value is equal then random allocation will be used as a tie-breaker. This will be carried out by an officer of Bolton Council independent to the School Admission Team
- The shortest walking route will be that determined by the Local Authority using only those public rights of way recognised within the measuring system. This will be measured using Routefinder, a computerised mapping system which uses the ordnance survey integrated network which measures from the point on the highway nearest to the centre of the home property and the designated main entrance to the school. In the event of a tie-break within a block of flats those living furthest from the communal entrance will be given priority.
- Where a single place remains at a school and the application being considered is for twins (etc.) the Council will allocate above the admission number to accommodate each child.

ADMISSION CRITERIA FOR RIVINGTON & BLACKROD VC HIGH SCHOOL SEPTEMBER 2017/2018

The Council will admit all children with a Statement of Special Educational Needs or an Education Health and Care Plan, in whose statement/plan the school is named

The Council will admit up to 318 pupils. If the school is over-subscribed the following criteria will be applied to all applications in priority order.

1. Children in Public Care (Looked After Children) who are the subject of a full care order including adopted children who were previously in care and children who leave care under a special guardianship or residence order. A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see definition in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989).
2. Other children who are considered as “vulnerable” whose application for the preferred school is supported by the Assistant Director for Social Care. This will include;
 - Children for whom there is a child protection plan or has been within a 12 month period.
 - Children who have had a period in care within 2 years of the admission application and are still receiving social care services
 - Children who are considered to be at significant risk of becoming looked after
 - Children who are living in temporary accommodation due to fleeing violence and the area for rehousing has been identified
3. Children who will have older siblings in years 7 to 11 of the preferred school time of application and the date of admission. Siblings can include full, step, half, foster and adopted brothers and sisters living at the same address.
4. Pupils who reside at an address which pays a “local parish precept” to Blackrod or Horwich Town Councils unless at any time that number exceeds the published admission number in which case pupils will be offered places on the basis of distance from school as determined in priority 7
5. Children who suffer from some medical condition or disability, which makes it, better for them to attend that school rather than another. Places will only be offered under this criterion if the child has a certified medical condition with strong professional supporting evidence confirming that existing exceptional problems with the child’s health would be seriously exacerbated if a place were not made at the preferred school. Parents applying under this criterion must provide a letter from the child’s GP/Consultant setting out the reasons why the school is the most suitable school and details of the child’s medical condition. Medical evidence must be submitted by 31st October 2016. Evidence received after this date will not be taken into consideration
6. Any remaining places not distributed under priorities 1 to 5 the school will admit 20% on the basis of commitment to the Christian faith. Parents must complete the schools supplementary form as evidence that the family and the child are active worshipping members at a Christian church. Active worshipping members will be those persons who worship at least once a month sustained over a period of the year prior to the closing date for applications. The supplementary form is available from Bolton Council tel. 01204 332137 or can be downloaded from Bolton Council’s website

- The shortest walking route will be that determined by the Local Authority using only those public rights of way recognised within the measuring system. This will be measured using Routefinder, a computerised mapping system which uses the ordnance survey integrated network which measures from the point on the highway nearest to the centre of the home property and the designated main entrance to the school. In the event of a tie-break within a block of flats those living furthest from the communal entrance will be given priority.

PROPOSED BOLTON LA CO-ORDINATED PRIMARY ADMISSION SCHEME FOR 2017/2018 ACADEMIC YEAR

Normal Year Admissions

- (a) All parents/carers of Bolton children must complete the Bolton LA application form for admission to the borough maintained primary schools. This will include children with a statement for special educational needs. Parents will also be given the option of applying on-line via the Council's website
- (b) The LA will provide parents with access details to the online application form which will be distributed to their registered home address. The booklet will be available to view or download from the Council's website. Hard copies will be available on request. For parents who are unable to apply online a paper preference form will be available and will be posted in December 2016 to all those who at that time have not submitted an online application.
- (c) The LA application form (and online application) will allow parents/carers to express at least 3 preferences in rank order and to state reasons for the preferences.
- (d) Parents/carers must return the completed form (or submit their online application) to the LA by 16th January 2017. The forms should be submitted to the LA's Pupil and Student Services (P&SS).
- (e) The procedures for processing application forms received after the closing date is given below.
- (f) The LA will forward relevant information from the application forms by 3rd February 2017 to other local authorities where Bolton residents have expressed a preference for a maintained school or academy in their area. On this date other LAs will provide details of preferences for Bolton schools or academies expressed by their residents
- (g) The Local Authority will forward relevant information from the application forms by 10th February 2017 to the admission authority schools and academies in Bolton where parents/carers have expressed a preference for them. The preference ranking for them will not be shared with the admission authorities in compliance with the School Admissions Code
- (h) Bolton admission authority schools and academies will inform the LA by 10th March 2017 of the priority ranking of all applicants according to their admission arrangements
- (i) By 17th March 2017 the LA will inform other local authorities of offers to be made to children resident within their areas and receive details of offers they will be making to Bolton residents. This information will continue to be exchanged until 31st March 2017
- (j) All parents/carers of Bolton children will receive letters from the LA informing them of the outcome of the application for admission to the borough primary schools on 17th April 2017. If admission is refused to the preferred school or academy, an appeal form(s) will be sent with the letter, which will inform parents/carers of the alternative school to be offered.
- (k) The LA will continue to co-ordinate admission arrangements until the end of the summer term 2018 and will hold a waiting list of all pupils whose preference for the school could not be met. This will mean the LA application form must be completed. The LA will provide the relevant admission authority details of children requesting admission. The LA will convey to parents/carers of Bolton children the outcome of their application.

LATE APPLICATIONS

1. LATE APPLICATIONS RECEIVED AFTER THE CLOSING DATE BUT BEFORE PLACES ARE ALLOCATED

The closing date will as far as possible be strictly observed. Late applications will only be considered after all the applications received by the closing date have been considered. Places will however be allocated and parents/carers will receive notification on 17th April 2017.

Only in exceptional circumstances where evidence is available will late applications be considered on time. These may include the following:

- parents who removed into the borough after the closing date
- parents/carers were abroad for the whole period between the publication of the LA's admission booklet and the closing date for the application form
- Parental/carer/child illness which required hospitalisation for the major part of the period between the publication of the LA's admission booklet and the closing date for the application form.

2. APPLICATIONS RECEIVED AFTER THE ALLOCATION DATE

The LA will continue to manage the co-ordinated admission arrangements after the allocation date i.e. 17th April 2017 until the end of the summer term 2018.

The LA form and any relevant documents will be passed on to the appropriate admissions authority for consideration. The LA will retain responsibility for informing parents/carers about the outcome of their application. If admission is refused to the preferred Borough school(s) or academy, an appeal form(s) will be sent with the letter, which will inform parents/carers of the alternative school to be offered.

WAITING LISTS AND CHANGE OF PREFERENCES

WAITING LIST

Bolton LA maintains waiting lists for admission to the borough schools and academies and for 2017 admissions this will be held until the end of the summer term 2018. Details of children who have not been offered a place at their preferred school(s), including late applicants will automatically be placed on the waiting list.

The waiting list will be compiled using the relevant published oversubscription criteria. As no distinction will be made between applications received on time and late applications, the waiting list will remain fluid.

The LA will maintain the waiting list until the end of the summer term 2018. Procedures for changing schools after this period are outlined in the policy relating to in year admissions.

A parent cannot add their name to the waiting list for a school that was not one of their original three preferences but can change their preferences after offer date on 17th April 2017 if necessary.

CHANGE OF PREFERENCES

A change of preference after the closing date 16th January 2017 will only be acceptable in exceptional circumstances. This is likely to be when there is a change of address. Verification must be provided e.g. letter from solicitor exchanging contracts or a tenancy agreement together with evidence to confirm permanent residency at the new address. The LA cannot change any preferences for whatever reason after 24th February 2017 until after the offer date of 17th April 2017.

BOLTON LEA CO-ORDINATED SECONDARY ADMISSION SCHEME FOR 2016.2017 ACADEMIC YEAR

Normal Year Admissions

- (a) All parents/ carers of Bolton children must complete the Bolton LA application form for admission to secondary maintained schools whether located in the Borough or in neighbouring LAs. This will include children with a statement for special educational needs/Education and Health Care Plan. Parents will also be given the option of applying online.
- (b) The LA will provide parents with access details to the online application form. The booklet will be available to view or download from the Council's website. Hard copies will be available on request. For parents who are unable to apply online a paper preference form will be available and will be posted at the end of September 2016 to all those who have not submitted an online application.
- (c) The application form (including the online application) will allow parents / carers to express 3 preferences in rank order and to state reasons for their preferences. This will include maintained schools in this and the neighbouring LAs. Parents/carers should only indicate an independent school if a place has been offered and they are sure a place will not be required at a maintained school.
- (d) If Canon Slade School, St James CE High School or Bolton Muslim Girls School are expressed as preferences, parents / carers must additionally complete the school application form which is obtainable from the school if they wish to apply under the school's faith criteria. The completed form must be validated by the Vicar / Faith Leader in time to enable parents to return it to the school by the deadline published by the school.
- (e) For Bolton children the completed LA application form along with other relevant supporting documents must be submitted on line or returned to the Bolton LA's Pupil & Student Services.
- (f) The closing date for the return of the completed LA preference form will be 31st October 2016. (The supplementary application form for Canon Slade, St James CE or Bolton Muslim Girls Schools will specify the closing date for return)
- (g) The procedures for processing application forms received after the closing date is given in below.
- (h) The LA will forward relevant information from the application form by 11th November 2016 to other local authorities where Bolton residents have expressed a preference for a maintained school or academy in their area. On this date other local authorities will provide details of preferences for Bolton schools and academies expressed by their residents.
- (i) The LA will forward relevant information from the application forms by 18th November 2016 to Bolton admission authority schools and academies where parents have expressed a preference for those schools and academies. The preference ranking will not be shared with the admission authorities in compliance with the Schools Admission Code.
- (j) Bolton admission authority schools and academies will inform the LA by 9th December 2016 of the priority ranking of all applicants
- (k) By 13th January 2017 the LA will inform other local authorities of offers to be made to children within their area and receive details of offers they will be making to children resident in Bolton. This information will continue to be exchanged until 31st January 2017.

- (l) All parents / carers of Bolton children will receive letters from the LA informing them of the outcome of the application for admission to Borough and neighbouring LA schools on 1st March 2017. If admission is refused to the preferred maintained school or academies an appeal form(s) will be sent with the letter, which will inform parents / carers of the alternative school to be offered. Where a place cannot be offered at a maintained school or academy or a neighbouring LA school(s)/academy, the LA's letter will advise parents / carers of their right of appeal and provide details of the appeals process.
- (m) The LA will continue to co-ordinate admission arrangements until the end of the autumn term. This will mean the LA application form must be completed. The LA will provide the relevant admission authority details of children requesting admission. The LA will convey to parents / carers of Bolton children outcome of their application.

LATE APPLICATIONS

1. LATE APPLICATIONS RECEIVED AFTER THE CLOSING DATE BUT BEFORE PLACES ARE ALLOCATED

If admission is refused to the preferred Borough community voluntary-controlled or voluntary-aided RC school(s), an appeal form(s) will be sent with the letter, which will inform parents / carers of the alternative school to be offered. Where a place cannot be offered at the Borough foundation, aided school(s) or Academy, in addition to the details about the alternative school offered, the LA's letter will advise parents / carers of their right of appeal and provide details of the appeals process.

WAITING LISTS & CHANGE OF PREFERENCES

WAITING LIST

The LA will maintain a waiting list for admission to the community & voluntary-controlled schools. Parents / carers of all unsuccessful applicants, including late applicants, will automatically be placed on the waiting list.

The waiting list will be compiled using the relevant published oversubscription criteria. As no distinction will be made between applications received on time and late applications, the waiting list will remain fluid.

A parent cannot add their name to the waiting list for a school that was not one of their original three preferences unless there is evidence of extenuating circumstances

The LA will maintain the waiting list until the end of the autumn term 2017.

CHANGE OF PREFERENCES

A change of preference will only be acceptable in exceptional circumstances. This is likely to be when there is a change of address. Verification must be provided e.g. letter from solicitor exchanging contracts or a tenancy agreement. The LA cannot change any preferences for whatever reason after 27th January 2017 until after the offer date of 1st March 2017.
