Play and Youth Service

Our core data protection obligations and commitments are set out in the council's **primary** privacy notice at www.bolton.gov.uk

This notice provides additional privacy information for:

- People accessing the Play and Youth Service
- Partners working with Bolton Council

It describes how we collect, use and share personal information about you

- In relation to the Play and Youth Service
- the types of personal information we need to process, including information the law describes as 'special' because of its sensitivity

It is important that you read this notice, together with any other privacy information we may provide on specific occasions when we are collecting or processing personal information about you, so that you are aware of how and why we are using such information.

The information collected and held will vary dependent on the service used.

Purpose(s)

We collect your personal information for the following purpose(s):

The service collects the personal data of young people participating in our activities and provision. Young people are in our care and so we need information to keep them safe and to contact legal guardians in case of emergencies.

Categories of personal data

In order to carry out these purposes we collect and obtain:

Names, dates of birth, addresses, contact information, medical conditions including allergies, medical information, religious requirements and emergency contact information. There will also be included activities for which explicit consent will be required.

Legal basis for processing

The legal basis for processing your personal information is:

There a number of legal bases for processing personal data in the provision of this service. These include:

- Children's Act 1989

- The explicit consent of participants

In respect of special category data the Council relies upon Article 9(2)(A) (Explicit consent) and 9(2)(G) Processing is necessary for reasons of substantial public interest.

If you fail to provide certain information when requested, we may not be able to perform the contract we have entered into with you or we may be prevented from complying with our legal obligations.

Information sharing/recipients

We may share personal information about you with the following types of organisations:

- Social Services and Greater Manchester Police (On request and around safeguarding a young person).
- Education providers
- Voluntary sector

We will not normally share your information with organisations other than our partner organisations; however, there may be certain circumstances where we would share without consent such as where we are required to do so by law, to safeguard public safety, and in risk of harm or emergency situations. Only the minimum information for the purpose will be shared.

As well as information collected directly from you, we also obtain or receive information from:

Social Services, Education providers and Greater Manchester Police (as part of packages of support or information sharing about a young person around safeguarding).

Automated Decisions

For this service:

- All the decisions we make about you involve human intervention

Data retention/criteria

We will only keep your personal information for as long as the law specifies or where the law does not specify this, for the length of time determined by our business requirements.

Rights of individuals

You may exercise the rights listed below in relation to the council's use of your personal information.
