3.	Tax Conditionality
	LT advised new HMRC legislation regarding drivers and operators to provide a 'Tax Check Code' at point of application commences on 04.04.22. and confirmed communications have been sent to drivers to advise. CO asked if it was mandatory which LT confirmed. MA asked when it had to be provided and LT advised at point of application.

	JF asked for any questions from the reps re highways. CO asked how the station was working and if highways had received any
	complaints. JF advised not aware of any issues or complaints.
	CO commented on the size of ranks and the increase in size of hackney vehicles. JF advised the ranks are marked out as one long bay not individual bays, some do have signs stating how many can rank up and these may need to be looked at if not as many can fit on.

	CO asked about rank provision for charging. JF confirmed at final stages of design and installation. JF asked what optimal position is for charging on the rank. CO

advised rear but commented not sure if appropriate on rank although handy and needs looking into.

YK asked if pick up and drop off is still available at front of train station. JF advised no, need to use the assigned bays in the car park.

MA raised issues with traffic lights on Thynne street junction causing back log, filter has been removed. JF advised TFGM model, signal team decide best set up.

Three areas raised as concerns-

- 3. Derby Street to Deane Road

BB discussed new concept starting up named 'taxi watch'. Operators to meet once a month to discuss issues such as problem areas, customers etc.

Work will be starting to look at dual badges shortly.
