Personal Reassurance Alarm Button

What is a personal reassurance alarm button?

The button is shower proof and steam proof so it can be fitted in a bathroom. The button can be fitted in the bath or shower area so it is within easy reach if the person was to slip or fall.

How does it work?

Once the button is pressed a radio signal is sent to Careline via the telephone line. Careline will then inform a family member if that is the response required or send a mobile officer to help the person.



Who is it for?

The personal reassurance alarm button is for anybody that is at risk from falls or slipping in the bathroom. It can be wall-mounted, so it can also be used for reassurance when walking up and down stairs.

Bogus Caller Alarm Button

What is a Bogus Caller Alarm Button?

Bogus callers are unwelcome visitors at your door that make you feel uneasy or unsafe in your own home. Bogus callers prey on vulnerable people in their own homes who are often too frightened to challenge their claims.

How does it work?

A bogus caller button can be fitted to any door, so that is always at hand to raise a call for help when necessary. Once the button is pressed a call immediately goes through to the Careline response centre, via the telephone alarm unit, who will contact a family member, neighbour or carer. The response centre will also talk to the person and guide them through the process of what they should do if there is a call at the door. All calls are recorded.

Who is it for?

The bogus caller alarm button is ideal for older or vulnerable people.
