

Proposed Traffic Regulation Order

TRO 303967 EXPERIMENTAL Chorley Old Rd / Marcus St Pedestrian Crossing Proposed traffic orders

The Council proposes to create and/or amend traffic orders as detailed within this document.

Statement of reasons

- 1. As part of the Mayor's Cycling and Walking Challenge Fund (MCF), TfGM in partnership with Bolton Council are planning to install a new Puffin crossing on Chorley Old Road, near the junction with Marcus Street, to replace the current Zebra crossing near the junction with Captains Clough Road. This will contribute to delivery of the Greater Manchester (GM) Active Bee Network, which will help enable more people to safely walk, wheel and cycle.
- 2. In order to facilitate the implementation of the new pelican crossing it is necessary to amend the existing waiting and parking restrictions and introduce a one-way street into Marcus Street
- 3. To secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic in pursuance of the Authority's duty under S.122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

Experimental Traffic Regulation Orders

An experimental order is much like a permanent traffic regulation order however, unlike a permanent order, an experimental order can only stay in force for a maximum of 18 months while its effects are monitored and assessed (and changes made if necessary). The Council will then decide whether or not to continue the experimental order on a permanent basis.

It is not possible to lodge a formal objection to an experimental traffic regulation order until it is in force. Once it is in force, objections may be made to the order being made permanent and these must be made within six months of the day that the experimental order comes into force.

If the experimental order is changed, then objections may be made within six months of the day that the experimental order is changed.

Marcus Street (southbound)





The Borough Council of Bolton, in exercise of the powers of the said Council under Sections 9, 10 and 11 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the said Act of 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police of Greater Manchester Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the said Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:

Citation and commencement

- 1. The Order shall be cited as "The Borough Council of Bolton, The Bolton (Chorley Old Road and Marcus Street) (Waiting Restrictions) (Experimental) (No.3) Order 2023."
- 2. The provisions of this Order will come into operation on the 30th October 2023 for a period not exceeding 18 months.
- 3. "The Borough Council of Bolton, The Bolton (Regulation of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) (Consolidation) Order 2015 (Chorley Old Road, Crofters, Junction to Whitecroft Road, Bolton (Amendment) (No. 49) Order 2016" is to be varied for a period not exceeding 18 months as follows:

The Borough Council of Bolton, in exercise of the powers of the said Council under Sections 9, 10 and 11 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the said Act of 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police of Greater Manchester Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the said Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:

1. Citation and Commencement

The Order shall be cited as "The Borough Council of Bolton, The Bolton (Marcus Street) (One Way Street) (Experimental) (No.4) Order 2023."

The provisions of this Order will come into operation on the 30th October 2023 for a period not exceeding 18 months.

- For the avoidance of doubt, where any length of road is described within the Schedule to this Order, that restriction (unless stated to the contrary within the Schedule to this Order) shall apply to the whole width of the road so described in those said lengths of road.
- 3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction of a police constable or a police community support officer in uniform, or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause any vehicle to proceed in the lengths of road specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order, in a direction other than that specified in relation to that length of road specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order.
- 4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order, shall render it unlawful to cause an ambulance, police vehicle, fire engine, or any vehicle used in the service of a fire and rescue authority or police force, to proceed in the lengths of road specified in Article 3 of this Order, during an emergency.
- 5. In so far as any provision of this Order conflicts with any other Order relating to the one way movement of traffic on the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule to this Order, this Order shall prevail.
