

Parking Services Annual Report Financial Year 2024-25

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Section 1: Introduction

The following report details the operations, enforcement, and financial activities of Bolton Council's Parking Services for the period 1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025. This report is intended to ensure transparency and accountability in all parking related activities.

Parking enforcement across Bolton is conducted by Civil Enforcement Officers (CEO's) who issue Penalty Charge Notices (PCN's) on regulated highway and car parks. Enforcement operates year-round, ensuring compliance with parking restrictions and other traffic regulations.

Bolton Council exercises powers granted under Civil Parking Enforcement (CPE) enabling enforcement not only of parking contraventions but also certain moving traffic offences, including bus lanes.

Section 2: Penalty Charge Levels

Penalty charges are set nationally and vary by type of contravention. Bolton Council enforces both parking and bus lane contraventions, with varying stator charge levels.

Higher Level: £70 (discounted to £35 if paid within 14 days)

Lower Level: £50 (discounted to £25 if paid within 14 days)

Standard rate: £70 (discounted to £35 if paid within 21 days)

Section 3. Enforcement

Parking Restriction Enforcement

Civil Enforcement Officers (CEOs) proactively enforce parking regulations across Bolton, addressing contraventions relating to waiting, loading, and parking restrictions. Enforcement covers all regulated highways, Controlled Parking Zones (CPZs), resident permit schemes, and council-operated car parks through routine patrols and targeted operations.

To support operational effectiveness, CEOs have limited dispensations allowing them to park temporarily in restricted areas while performing essential enforcement duties, but only where no lawful alternative parking is reasonably available. This approach ensures enforcement activities are carried out efficiently without negatively impacting traffic flow, pedestrian safety, or residential accessibility.

Bus Lane Enforcement (CCTV)

Bus lane contraventions are actively monitored and enforced using CCTV systems at strategic locations.

School Enforcement

School Keep Clear School safety zones marked "School Keep Clear" are proactively monitored by rotating CEO patrols. This targeted approach effectively promotes compliance and enhances pupil safety during peak school hours.

Future Enforcement Developments

In the coming year, it is anticipated Bolton Council will expand its enforcement capabilities by introducing Moving Traffic Enforcement (MTE) powers, as provided under Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004. This expansion will address additional contraventions, including box junction misuse, prohibited turns, and other moving traffic violations. These strategic enhancements aim to further improve traffic management, road safety, and overall compliance within Bolton.

Section 4: Enforcement Arrangements

On-street parking enforcement is contracted to NSL Ltd, whose Civil Enforcement Officers (CEOs) issue PCN's directly for observed contraventions.

Contraventions captured via CCTV enforcement, including bus lanes, are also reviewed by NSL ltd. Confirmed contraventions are subsequently passed through to the Parking Services notice-processing system, where postal regulation 10 PCN's are issued by council officers.

All PCN processing, including the management of appeals and representations, is handled internally by the Council's Parking Services team.

Section 5: Appeals and Representations

PCN appeals received in the financial year 2024/25:

Upheld: Informal 1710 Representations 323

All representations and appeals are considered in-house by specially trained council appointed Parking Services team members, who assess each case on its individual merits and in accordance with statutory guidance and local enforcement policy.

If a motorist remains dissatisfied with the outcome of their representation, they may appeal to the independent Traffic Penalty Tribunal (TPT). Section 6: Car Parks

NCP operate the councils pay and display car parks in the Bolton Town centre as part of a management agreement.

Bolton council also operates free car parks across the borough, further details on the free car parks in operation can be found at: <u>Free Car Parks</u>. It is important that drivers check any signage when parking on a car park to ensure they are parking in line with the restrictions specified.

Section 7: Residents Parking Permits

Bolton council operates 3 resident permit zones; the areas are listed below:

- Zone A Court Street, Dorset Street, Dowson Street, May Street
- Zone C Edward Street, Marsden Street, Wood Street
- Zone D Mill Street

Section 8: Suspensions and Dispensations

Suspensions

Bolton Council allows parking restriction suspensions in specific areas to support essential activities such as building works, utility repairs, and special events. These temporary suspensions permit vehicles to park where restrictions would otherwise apply, helping facilitate short-term operational needs.

Application Process:

- Applications must be submitted in advance using the official Council request form.
- Each request is assessed on a case-by-case basis and is subject to availability.
- A charge is applied to facilitate the suspension, the fee is outlined on the councils website at Streets and parking: Request a parking bay suspension

Conditions and Eligibility:

Suitable for activities where vehicle access is necessary and no lawful alternative is available. Filming requests.

Suspended areas must be clearly indicated and strictly adhered to.

The Council reserves the right to withdraw the suspension if misused.

Dispensations

Bolton Council provides the option to request temporary parking dispensations for vehicles that need to be parked in contravention of normal restrictions to facilitate essential activities. These may include building works, utility maintenance, or specialist deliveries where access is critical, and no lawful parking alternative exists.

Key Points:

- Dispensations are considered on a case-by-case basis.
- Applications must be submitted in advance using the Council's official request form.
