Both on and off premises – Outdoor music will stop at 22:00.

**Performance of Dance:** Monday – Thursday 09:00 – 00:00, Friday 09:00 - 01:00, Saturday 10:00 – 01:00, Sunday 10:00 – 00:00  
Both on and off premises – Outdoor dance will stop at 22:00.
