THE DOGS ON LEADS PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER (2026)

The Borough Council of Bolton in exercise of its powers under Sections 59, 60, and 72 of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Police Act 2014 (“the Act”) hereby make the following Order: -

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 20th October 2026 and shall have effect for three years thereafter, unless extended by further Orders under the Council’s statutory powers.

2. This Order relates to public spaces as specified on the Order Schedule, hereinafter referred to as ‘the Restricted Area’

3. — (1) A person in charge of a dog shall be guilty of an offence if, at any time on any land to which this Order applies, he does not keep the dog on a lead of not more than 6 feet in length, unless —

- (a) he has a reasonable excuse for failing to do so; or
- (b) the owner, occupier or other person or authority having control of the land has consented (generally or specifically) to his failing to do so.

(2) For the purposes of this article a person who habitually has a dog in his possession shall be taken to be in charge of the dog at any time unless at that time some other person is in charge of the dog.

4. The Council is satisfied that the conditions set out in Sections 59, and 72 of the Act of 2014 have been satisfied and that it is in all the circumstances expedient to make this Order for the purposes of combatting nuisance within the Restricted Area caused by dogs when not properly supervised and kept under control, activities which have had a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality. The effect or likely effect of this is of a persistent or continuing nature such as to make this unreasonable and justifies the restrictions imposed by this Order.

5. A person found in breach of this Order shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale.

6. If any interested person desires to question the validity of this Order on the grounds that the Council has no power to make it or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with in relation to this Order, he or she may apply to the High Court within six weeks from the date on which this Order is made.
