| Performance and Achievements | There are currently 17,019¹ fuel poor households living in Bolton, which equates to 14.8% of all households. This is a reduction from 19.7% of all households in 2013. We have committed to Climate Local and published a Risk Log which is available at; http://www.bolton.gov.uk/website/pages/Sustainabledevelopment.aspx Bolton has achieved the following successes; Delivery of 7973 ECO measures, which equates to 67.4 measures per 1000 households (to end September 14). 1815 Green Deal Assessments carried out 29 Green Deal Home Improvement Fund vouchers paid 166 measures installed under the Greater Manchester Toasty scheme (Apr 13-May14) including; boiler replacement, external wall, cavity and loft insulation. 277 measures in 197 households installed under the Greater Manchester Little Bill scheme (May 14-Sep14) including; boiler replacement, heating controls, loft, roof, under floor and cavity wall insulation. 200 energy efficient measures installed between Apr 13 – Dec 15 through Bolton's local Affordable Warmth schemes, reducing the annual carbon dioxide emissions and annual fuel bills of those households. Between 2013-15 we have secured over £164k additional funding from partners involved in our Warm Home Healthy People Steering Group to replace the Department of Health 'Warm Homes Healthy People' funding and enable us to set up schemes to help people keep warm in winter. | On going | | |

This funding has now been extended to September 2015 and we will explore opportunities for further schemes with our framework partner.
