Achieve is a dedicated service for anyone in Bolton, Salford or Trafford experiencing problems with drugs and/or alcohol. We are here to help you get well and stay well.

We believe anyone living with a substance misuse problem can recover and we are here to help you achieve that. We also help people who support someone with a substance misuse issue.

As you take that first step in getting help, we can work together and find the right treatment, care and support that is right for you. This can include:

- Talking therapies and groups to help understand any underlying causes of substance misuse
- Support with housing to make sure you stay in the most appropriate accommodation that meets your needs



- Harm reduction strategies such as needle exchanges to help keep you as safe as possible
- Education, employment, volunteering and training opportunities – all of which can help you stay well and motivated
- Specialist help for families and young people so that people who are affected by addiction can be supported
- Clinical help to support the physical aspects of addiction such as managed detoxifications and drug replacement programmes
- Peer support we can introduce you to people who have gone through what you have been through and can help you with their personal experience

Whatever your experience or whatever stage you are at, we can help you achieve a future towards recovery and wellbeing. We are here for anyone who:

- Is worried about their drinking or drug use
